He is the esteemed Chairman and Consultant of Critical Care Medicine at the Manipal Hospital in Whitefield, Bangalore. Dr. Sunil was a part of the very first batch of trainees of the National Board in critical care medicine. He has been given a fellowship in the College of Intensive Care Medicine in Australia. It is said that he has pioneered the field of critical care medicine in India. He is an Examiner and a Senior Teacher for the National Board's training programme in Critical Care Medicine and has also written textbooks about the subjects. He also acts as a teacher and examiner for the Fellowship program in Critical Care Medicine conducted by the Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine. Only a few people in India have completed all the 3 qualifications in the field of Internal Care Medicine, but he has successfully done this. He is well-known for his skills in working in the ICU for critically ill patients using extracorporeal devices such as ECMO. Dr. Sunil is the best internist in Whitefield, Bangalore. He

completed his MD in Internal Medicine from the Kasturba Medical College in Mangalore after completing his MBBS. He has also done a European Diploma in Intensive Care and an FNB in Critical Care Medicine from the Manipal Hospital located in Bangalore. He is registered as an Intensive Care Consultant at Australia's Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA). He has participated in many national and international conferences like the National Conference in Critical care medicine organised by Criticare in 2015. He has a fellowship in the Australia and New Zealand College of Intensive Care Medicine. He has talked about issues like the rising prices of Oxygen, cardiac emergencies, the shortage of Tocilizumab injections, etc., during the crisis of COVID-19 in India. Many newspapers like the Indian Express, the Bangalore Mirror, the Times of India, etc., asked him for his views about these topics for their articles. He also educated many people about monitoring oxygen levels at home during COVID-19. He has worked in many areas, like mechanical ventilation, renal replacement therapy, dialysis, and renal replacement therapy. He started the neuro-critical care field in India and pioneered the utility of point-of-care ultrasonography while working in the ICU. He has received training in this field from three continents- Asia, Australia, and Europe.
